Approximate Time Commitment/ Hours per month	Walking tours typically take one to two hours; large groups may be divided up into two or three groups, with one or two docents in each group, and the total time commitment may be three hours or more per program. Typical time commitment is 4-8 hours per month. Needs are greatest from Feb-May.
