Mayor Katy Geissert of Torrance from 1986 to 1994 wrote the following for the Marsh Mailing Spring 1987 edition.

"By nature, I am a saver. So when Shirley Turner asked me to write a statement on the Madrona Marsh and the Friends, it gave me an excuse to pull out dusty files filled with over 20 years of accumulation of newspaper clippings, reports, and notes.

The battle to save the Marsh was a long and colorful one and had all the drama of a classic planning and political saga. It was a battle fought and won by people who had faith in and dedication to the value of their vision.

When I first became Mayor in 1986, my first goal was to finalize an agreement with the owners of the property and to gain title to the Marsh. After prolonged negotiations, that goal was realized, and the property was deeded to the City "in perpetuity" as a nature habitat.

Viewing the Marsh today, lush after the winter rains and lovingly cared for by all of you. I am convinced that the movement to save Madrona Marsh was one of the worthiest causes in the history of our city."

When she passed in 2000, the Honorable Steven Kuykendall, California House of Representatives, honored Geissert during a session of the House. He said, in part,

"Katy will be missed. The community she represented is a better place to live because of her service."

The Friends of Madrona Marsh could not agree more with this sentiment.

A STATEMENT FROM OUR CURRENT RESIDENT ARTIST

My reflections and direction during the residence project were to formally and conceptually address the Marsh and its species through thoughtful interactive artworks. These studies and related information were embedded into contemporary visual arrangements that beautify as well as define real-time environmental concerns, awareness, and the natural beauty of the Marsh. I created a cohesive interactive series of Obelisk-styled sculptures. The shapes of the sculptures resemble oil drilling platforms from the past as a reference to the geographical history of the area. The sculptures are constructed from wood materials to create four themes related to the Marsh. *Grow, Swim, Crawl,* and *Fly* presents a feeling of connectivity with the Marsh and each other.


